President's Message

Winter - Brrrr! I'm looking out over our frozen pond while I write. My Farmdogs are always happy to go out for a run in our snow covered New England woods and fields, but they sure do love to curl up under any available blanket (a form of Farmdog hibernation many of you are no doubt familiar with!) or sprawl in front of or on top of any available heat source. This often includes any nearby human body, much to my glee...

The Board of Directors enjoyed reconnecting after our holiday break for our first meeting of the new year. Don't forget, all DSFCA members are always welcome to listen in on any BOD meeting. Dates, times and call in credentials are posted in the member section of the website.

The BOD began the exciting process of shaping our agenda and goals for 2020. As we enter the second year of our successfully merged club, major admin work is behind us (for now) and we can focus on defining

and strengthening the club's role in supporting and protecting the DSF as its popularity grows. This will be a year of some heavy lifting, creative thinking and an all hands on deck climate.

We identified and prioritized six main areas of concentration. Progress in each of these areas will be facilitated by the active participation of club members. Additional input and ideas from members are welcome year round. Some of these are far reaching and broad goals and will take some years and many volunteer hours to complete. Others must be completed this year. We will begin by outlining specifics and assembling work committees. Keep an eye out for details (and pleas for help!).

1. Website

Our website has been carefully tended by our webmaster, Sally Frankel, for many, many years and while Sally will remain in that position, we are exploring the feasibility of

creating at least a part of the site that can be updated by non-professionals. As the club matures, we will need the ability to share this creative task with volunteering club members.

2. Education

We intend that DSFCA have a robust educational program. It will be developed to encompass three main areas of concentration:

- Breeder Program
We will begin work on a voluntary education, accreditation and recognition program that will provide DSFCA breeders a way to stand out as THE professionals the public wants to get their DSF pup from. Setting the bar high with a continuing education program will allow our breeders to separate themselves from unscrupulous puppy producers and fly by nighters.
- Judges Education Program
American judges will have an outsize influence in shaping the future of the breed in this country. We will begin the work of building a judge's education curriculum and outreach program so that USA judges learn correct type and temperament as per the (Danish/Swedish) countries of origin descriptions and guidelines that underpin our official breed standard.
- Public Education
This program is intended for the public and would serve as both a revenue stream for DSFCA and an opportunity for our members to stay abreast of the latest in canine health, training and general knowledge. It would consist of seminars and online classes with content focused towards both dog professionals and pet owners.

3. AKC Recognition

We continue our steady march towards AKC recognition. We have reached the critical number of registered dogs. We continue work to create, compile and complete the required documents, surveys and events.

4. Events and Fundraising

We are exploring our ability to sponsor and organize an AKC Open Show to take place in Orlando in Dec 2020. This could function as a National Specialty, judges education opportunity and fundraiser. It would also fulfill an event requirement for AKC recognition.

We anticipate setting up a "store" on our website that will offer Farmdog customized apparel, gifts and novelties.

We are all looking forward to putting together the 2021 annual Farmdog calendar.

5. Developing an Audit committee

As per the request of our devoted treasurer, Linda Avsharian, we are actively looking for a reliable and consistent sidekick for her. If you have a head for detail and an eye for numbers, we want you!

6. Elections

We will be having our first formal elections this year to fill termed out seats on the BOD. Come join the fun and consider running! Keep an eye out for details...

We welcome input and help on any of these projects. Think about what skills you have that you could contribute. Get involved in shaping the club that will be THE Farmdog community touchstone.

I've been working with Pixel, my 6-year-old Farmdog, for most of his life. He's my sport dog for flyball and agility, my trick dog in training, my show dog (when we participate in shows). Among these other things, he also works with me in 4-H. This year will be my sixth year in the Dane County 4-H dog project.

The first year I showed Pixel in the dog project, it crashed and burned, to put it bluntly. During obedience practices, Pixel did everything perfectly. He was even able to heel off-leash and perform almost flawlessly. I was confident in him until the second we stepped into the ring at the fair. As soon as he set a paw on the carpet, his nose hit the ground and his brain was gone. Long story short, we took last place overall.

The second year the same thing happened. And the third. All the while his obedience skills were suffering inside the ring, his showmanship skills excelled. He managed to win Reserve Champion our second year and we even took Grand Champ our third year. He would have taken one of

the two champions the first year we competed if it weren't for a small mishap that led to a disqualification.

Last year was my fourth year working with Pixel, and I decided to try a little different approach. Since I was a Youth Leader and wasn't actually signed up to go to practices with him, our at-home practices were adapted. Usually I would be working on trick training him in the basement. I turned half of that time into distraction work. We took walks while heeling, conditioning outside the library, and even did some off-leash work at indoor 4-H practices.

All of this work did eventually pay off. We took third blue together, the equivalent of the placing below Reserve Champ. Even though some of his habits are questionable, he's a Good Boy and we work well together as a team. Pixel will be my trusty Demo Dog, and hopefully we can work on making our way up to the dark purple ribbon, taking home Grand Champion in obedience.

A Common Bond

Getting a puppy is an adventure. It starts with research and dreams of what might be with just the right puppy at your side. My Cavalier is 9 years old and basically retired after earning his RACH, so I had been thinking of getting another small breed. I think it's easier to travel with small dogs. They fit under an airline seat so the world can be our oyster. Aimee & Ken Kincaid are friends of mine and I had been admiring Aimee's Danish-Swedish Farmdog, "Tchotchke". When Aimee decided to breed her lovely bitch, I asked her to consider adding me to the list of folks wanting a puppy.

The Danish-Swedish Farmdog, of course, originated in Sweden and Denmark where they work small farms. They herd, catch rats, guard, and they are all-around great working dogs. Very biddable with a smooth coat, females are about 16 to 18 pounds and about 14 inches tall, while males run 20 to 22 pounds and about 15 inches tall. They have no known genetic health issues. As of now they are registered with AKC in Foundation Stock Service (FSS), but eventually they will end up in the working group. They may look like small terriers, but they are actually a pinscher type of dog.

I had seen the work Ken and Aimee put into their Australian Shepherd litters, so I knew these pups would be special in many ways. Tchotchke was bred to a gorgeous male named Pip owned by Dorothy Herman. It seemed like forever waiting for the pups to be born as Tchotchke's girth expanded. Finally, on August 12 the pups made their grand debut. Four tiny bundles of wonder – two boys, two girls. Each one more precious than the last. Although determined not to choose a puppy on impulse, I was naturally drawn to the girls. My male Cavalier has been wonderful and is deeply devoted to me, but I have always favored the girls. Mainly because I like my dogs to be a little more independent and a little less clingy, and that has been my experience with the girls. These are just personal observations and I'm sure others would disagree with my point of view.

What an awesome and very consistent litter of puppies! Every week I had a new favorite. Aimee started a facebook page for the puppies, but since

I don't do facebook I had to go see them in person. Fortunately, I only live about 20 minutes away. Aimee does the Early Neurological Stimulation (ENS) handling promoted by Dr. Carmen Battaglia on his web site – Breeding Better Dogs. This is the link if you would like to read the article: <https://breedingbetterdogs.com/article/early-neurological-stimulation> Also called Biosensor or Super Puppy program, it was originally developed to produce better dogs for war. The simple handling technique can produce dogs that are literally bomb proof, that recover from stress more quickly, are smarter and healthier in general. In addition to ENS Aimee also included Early Scent Introduction (ESI). ESI was developed by Golden Retriever breeder Gail Watkins and has been proven to produce dogs that earn higher titles involving scent at half the age. During the same time frame as ENS the puppies are offered something new to smell every day. It's a simple way to kick those scenting neurons in the brain into high gear. In addition to all the special handling the pups were offered many surfaces, wobble boards, tunnels, a variety of toys and treats, mazes to run, a kiddie pool with empty water bottles in it, etc. They also use a litter box in their whelping area. They met Aimee's extended family which includes children, and Aimee has an awesome cat named Hannibal that thinks he's the puppies' Uncle. He is tolerant of them hanging off his ear, and if they get too rough he gently reigns in their behavior. Perfect. When the pups were 6 weeks we loaded them into a wire kennel in a wagon and took them to Winter Park – a dog friendly community where they got to see a variety of people, heard motorcycle engines, a train, Church bells, and enjoyed delicious scents wafting out from several restaurants.

At seven weeks of age came the puppy testing. Our thanks to Victory Hulett, a lovely person and very accomplished trainer, who did the puppy test for Aimee. I often do the test for Aimee's litters, but being so close to the litter it was important to have someone they didn't know administer the test. The

puppies are named after Florida Authors. First was Carl Hiaasen, a big boy with a mostly dark face. Carl is a tug fanatic and fast as a rocket. Nothing throws him off his game, so I expect he will make a spectacular Agility dog. In the litter he was always doing something silly that would cause us to exclaim "Oh, Carl". He'll be a lot of fun. Next tested was Ann Beattie. Ann is a lovely little girl, mostly black with a lot of brown on her face. She has perhaps the highest "cute factor" of the bunch, always seeming to know how to get her way. She did a solid job on the puppy test, bold and thoughtful, confident on obstacles and surfaces, and a natural retriever. Next came Jimmy Buffett. Jimmy is just a gorgeous boy with some white markings on his face and neck. He always looks like he's taking time to size things up. During the test he was a bit more subdued than I expected, but I think he had just awoken as he was better toward the end of the test than at the beginning. Whoever gets him will be lucky, indeed! Last, but far from least, was Judy Blume. Judy has the most white markings and is just stunningly beautiful. She is captivating. She did not like the noise test much, but bounced back very fast so that should not be an issue for her. At the end of the test, Victory indicated that if she had to pick one, she would choose Judy Blume. But I already knew which puppy had captured my heart – it was little Ann Beattie. She had charmed me from the beginning, and although I tried my best not to be drawn toward one puppy or another, I couldn't help coming back to her time and again. She's the one I watched the most, the one I wanted to hold, the one I just knew I was meant to have.

So I've made my choice and now the real work begins! The puppy test is done at 7 weeks, but MY puppy won't be coming home until she is 11 or 12 weeks old. I have a "problem child" old Cavalier who came to me as a barker and he still 'alarm' barks, and I don't want anything at home influencing my puppy during the fear imprint stage that runs from 8 to 10 weeks. Besides, they continue to learn a ton of information from their dam and littermates, so there is no rush to get her home. I can see her almost every day and we are already forming a bond.

Most of the puppies have been responding to their names all along, except Ann. I didn't want to go with Ann (which is also my middle name) or Annie, so I decided to go with Daisy. Daisy is the name of a dog belonging to a character in Ann Beattie's book, *Secrets and Surprises*, which will be my puppy's registered name. Daisy also originated as a name in Sweden, so it seems perfect for her. It is a cheery sound that is hard to make sound harsh. She learned her new name in a day. She learned to sit in one lesson when I hold a cookie up high. She also learned not to fight the light leash she was dragging when I would occasionally use it to stop her. I am working with all of the puppies, but Daisy gets most of my time and efforts. I am currently introducing them to a variety of chewies and foods and taking them on adventures in the yard.

Next month – now the real work begins!
